A Note for You...



Columbus Darters Association,

I just wanted to take a brief moment to write a short article about my experience playing the newly structured Columbus Pro-League. I have been an off and on again member of Pro-League for the last 4 years, but never played frequently enough to make a splash in the standings that usually took a year or two of constant play to get to the top of. With the newly instituted format of each 12 - week season having a money winner, and a yearly champion, Bruce has found a way to keep the traditional incentive of the league, while allowing for someone to play a shorter season and reap the benefits of a cash award.

Having previously played in many leagues ranging from highly competitive to being able to win by kicking my darts up at the board, I began the season ready for anything. Because of the wide collection of talent that signed up for the inaugural season, I wasn't disappointed either and was able to pull off both some impressive wins and some painful losses. Due to the highly competitive format of the league (all singles head to head matches that are best out of 3) everyone seemed to bring their best darts almost I every week and it was an incredible challenge to try and stay in the money. But more important than money, Pro-League is the only available league that was able to give me valuable experience playing by myself in a best of 3 format. In other leagues that I've played in, there are always multiple matches that you can rely on another darter to help you out in, but in Pro-League, a darter has to rely on their own skill or luck to win the games. This is experience that can not be measured when it comes time to play in singles events at such tournaments as the Bloodshot and Buckeye Open.

In closing, I have found the Columbus Pro-League to be an invaluable asset to my progression as a dart player and I am sure that any other darter who has the available time and desire to improve, will also. The league is going to be starting up again on May 9^{th} at the Crestview Tavern and I look forward to seeing more of the area darters joining in.

SCOREKEEPER'S ETIQUETTE

- 1. Scorekeepers Shall Not talk while keeping score!
- 2. Scorekeepers Shall Not move about while keeping score, stand still!
- 3. Scorekeepers Shall Not look at the shooter, stand facing the board!
- 4. Scorekeepers Shall Not call out a score, of one dart or all three unless the shooter asks you!
- 5. Scorekeepers Shall Not tell a shooter what to shoot or what combination to shoot for an out!
- 6. Scorekeepers Shall Not change a score unless it is brought to the attention of both shooters (teams).
- 7. Scorekeepers Shall Not change a score regardless if that player (team) has shot again and a second score written down. An error in a shooter's score MUST be corrected before he (team) shoots again or it stands.
- 8. Scorekeepers Shall Not lean out to see where a dart is or is going, nor shall he follow the darts with body or head movement!
- 9. Scorekeepers Shall Not show any sign of disgust or excitement while at the scoreboard!
- 10. Scorekeepers Shall Not change the side of the score sheet of the player in three-leg matches...if you start a player on the left side of the score sheet, continue to keep his score on the left-regardless of what the bull shots are.


