

HELP!

In some games you are behind, in some games you are in the lead - a dart player's usual business. Both situations have their own typical mental consequences. The most common situation is that the (supposed to be!) better player is in front. That's a normal situation which both players are "used to". In most cases the weaker player resigns at some point of the match, and then it's all over. It usually is easy to see who is behind only by looking at the players' behavior. The behind player will lower his head and shoulders, usually shake his head or even nag or grumble. Well, only a mentally weak player would do so.

In such situations where you are a way behind it is important to think about what your look is like. Check yourself for what I mentioned above. Do you look like a loser? Then you normally are a loser. The player who is in front is expecting this. Raise your shoulders, raise your head and step to the oche in full confidence. Don't care about the standings in the match. Just look like a winner. Your opponent will recognize your confident look and maybe (if he is mentally weak) begin to think about why you look as if you were in the lead. And this is your chance. Once you get your opponent to think a little more than usual, he may lose his balance. Of course you will have to throw some good darts to close up, but if you look strong and confident (even if you actually don't feel strong and confident) real strength and confidence are often coming to you. If you look like the boss on the board it's not unusual that you in fact will become the boss!

Of course this needs practice. So take care of your behavior during dart matches. Ask a friend to watch your play. After the match he can tell you which impression he had of your behavior. After a while it won't be difficult for you to recognize yourself what effect your look has to your opponent, and then you will be able to control it properly.

In the next issue of HELP we will look on situations where the weaker player faces himself with the unusual situation of being in the lead, which surprisingly puts him usually in trouble.

Getting New Ideas

Hello Darters, as a recent addition to the CDA board, I have chosen a specific task to recruit new players. The rest of the board supports it and in order to make it happen I need all of your support. I have noticed in the past 3 years we have been losing darters quicker than we are gaining them. The first year I noticed a lot of the same faces were at every event. The second year less of them, and this year even less. Which is to be expected, people get better jobs, move away, get married and start families. The bigger problem is that their absences are not being filled. I am working on several ideas to try and get people more interested in the sport and get the turn-outs up. This will benefit everyone!

Everyone knows someone at work or elsewhere that either used to play or wants to play but is afraid they will get killed by the better darters. A place we have all been at one point. It can be something as simple as inviting someone from work to a blind draw or tournament even if it is just to watch. The first Buckeye Open I attended was as a spectator and by the Bloodshot I was at the Control desk signing up. Some times all it takes is getting 3 darts in your hand and hitting one good shot to... well you know. I would like to invite everyone to try and put a more welcoming, encouraging and positive attitude on bring new talent into the sport.

Darting Memoirs ~ My First Set of Darts!

RALPH 'BIG DUMB' SMITH: I was 16 years old and occasionally smoked camel lights and I used the camel cash (c note's in the back of the pack) and got me a set of darts. When they came in the mail on Thursday night, I went to the local bar and threw in a blind draw tourney. I didn't fare well, but this made me determined to get better and throw more to be able to win. Then the next draw I finished 2nd and then I got into the bigger tourney's. But, that's a later story...

BRYANT CAVE: My first set of darts were purchased from Bob Brewer at Darts USA for \$20 in the fall of 1994. I played up at Mama's Pasta and Brew every now and then and Brewer said that I should head up to the Indianola store and get my own set of darts if I was going to be playing as much as I was. I did just that and picked up a cheap set of 24 or so gram darts. I played with these for around 6 months when I lost one and I moved onto 25 gram double indented Budweiser darts that were a gift from my loving sister.

TODD 'BANKROLL' LAMANNA: A couple years after I graduated from college, I used to come to Columbus to visit my brother and we would almost always end up at Zuey's playing darts or pool on Sunday afternoons after golfing in the morning. Since I was always either using bar darts or sharing his, he bought me a set of steel tip darts for Christmas that year so that I could get used to using the same set all the time. I believe the year was 1997.

ANNE STRAYER: Wow, I think my first darts were hand-me-downs made out of spare parts from Rich's dart supplies. I had never thrown darts when I met him (or I should say when I was tricked into playing with him) at an in-house dart league. I was going to borrow this other guy's spare darts for the season, but I was thrilled when Rich offered to let me play with his. We won the league and a few months later, Rich bought me a dart case and flights for my "new" darts.

DON YOUNG: My first set of darts were "borrowed" from my roommate Bob. I asked to use them so I could go celebrate Tammy's friend Mary's birthday, just a bunch of us getting together to drink and throw. This was also about the second time I ever threw. I met quite a few darters that night, and I had a blast. Two months later I was throwing in my 1st Bloodshot, and almost three years later, Bob still has no darts. He eventually gave them to me. I no longer throw them but if it hadn't been for him having them, me needing them, I might not have realized how much fun, frustration, excitement and beer I can actually drink in a 12 hour period or how addictive this game that I've come to love, really is. "Thanks Bob."

The new format is now posted on the message board. To summarize it, everything is based on sets.

A set is best of 3 games. Tier 1 will be first to 4 Sets. Tier 2 first to 3 sets and everyone else will be first to 2 sets.

For those playing in the Cricket ladder, please post your feedback on the format, so we can fine tune it for next year.

Craig's attempt was to get the matches to be about the same length they where in the 501 ladder (not necessarily the same number of games).

Craig indicated it will take some playing to figure out what that level should be. Please be patient and check the message board often for updates.

Players in the 501 ladder will retain their positions in the Cricket ladder, and new people will fill in the bottom.

If you where in the ladder before, you have until August 1, to pay and stay in the Cricket Ladder, without losing your position.

Craig will be working out the payouts for the 501 season and getting that money to those who won. Watch for the winners to be announced in the fall newsletter.

For everyone else, this is the perfect time to join the ladder. Cost is again \$30 with weekly payouts.

This is also the first season that the ladder will be a feeder into the September Cricket all-star event. So that's another good reason to join the ladder to improve your cricket skills and represent Columbus.

The season will last until September 31. October 1st we will start the 501 ladder again.

Because of the tender care Joe received and the genuine goodness of the staff and services provided to Joe, his family, and his friends, Jan believes in The Kobacker House with all of her heart and has continued to host the Summer Splash for the last eight years.
