Beer and Pop taps need to be changed periodically.


In short, YOU are needed as a volunteer!

BURMA ROAD

What the heck is this, some highway in Asia? I thought this newsletter was about darts, not geography!

The name may be strange, but the dart game is fun. Also known as "Halves-It", Burma Road requires specific number accuracy.

It's played using only 20, 19, triples, 18, 17, doubles, 16, 15, and corks. Each player or team throws only three darts at each of the object numbers, and only darts hitting the object number that turn count. Fail to hit at least one dart in the object number, and your score gets cut in half.

Each player or team starts with 40 points. You score whatever your darts are, but only in the object number for that turn and add it to the previous balance.



Lets look at a typical game between player A & B.

Player B wins the game!

Try this game the next time you are practicing or warming up. You will find that it's a big help for your cricket game (especially the triples). The key thing to remember is that in each round only the object number that round counts. Even if you hit it with your first dart, if the other two land in any other number than the object number, they don't count.



April 25 at the Crest at 7:30 There's a qualifier for any additional members who wish to try for a spot at the Regional Playoffs. Cost is \$5.




ADO WINMAU WORLD MASTER COMPETITION

PLAYING SITE RELATIONS by Charlie Forrester

Thanks to all teams who completed Playing Site Evaluation Forms, both positive and negative, over the past two seasons. These don't just get stuck in a file somewhere and forgotten about.

If there's a problem such as worn boards, which can be corrected easily, we naturally do our best to get in touch with the owner/manager and ask that they fix it.

Larger problems, such as overall conditions, often can't be corrected that easily, and have to wait until the next season. Naturally, if there is a big problem with a site that isn't corrected, we would be leery of using them again.

It is almost impossible to replace a site once a season starts. A case in point is Lefty's last Fall. We found out the first night of play that they had closed. We were able to reschedule at another site, and communicated that fact in standing sheets for at least 6 weeks. We were still getting calls about it the 12th week of the season.

In reading through the
Evaluation Forms I sometimes
get the feeling that how your
team played a on given night
affects what you think of a
site. That's only natural, but
try to be objective. Just
because you or your team had a
bad night, don't blame it on
the playing site.

There are a couple of things that have come up several times that I'd like to clarify.



OUT CHARTS:

It is completely up to the site whether they post out charts on the wall or not. Some don't have room or it doesn't fit their decor.

RESERVED SIGNS:

Again, it's up to the site. We urge them to put them up because it has C.O.D., address info and gets our name out. Most sites like them because it helps them clear the boards for league play. If a site doesn't have one up, and there is no problem having the boards clear for league play, there's really no problem.

TOE LINE SIGN:

We gave these out about 10-12 years ago when the throwing distance changed. The Rule Book is very clear about where the line starts and there really isn't any need for them.

One thing everyone has to keep in mind is that C.O.D. league play is only one thing going on in a particular site that night. If there are several boards and other patrons want to throw we can't object too loudly, unless they are disrupting or interfering with our league play.

In short, be reasonable. Every place you play isn't going to be perfect. Every board won't be fresh out of the box. What's a great place to throw to you may not be to someone else. What to you is a lousy place to throw may be great to someone else.

We all need to be a little flexible and understanding.

Likewise, your Board of Directors needs to be aware of your concerns and feelings about sites we play at. Hopefully this past year has gotten a little better, and will continue to improve.




