

ETIQUETTE

It's the start of 301 singles. You throw your first dart. Then it happens, that"@#\$&*" chalker leans over to look to see if its in the double.

You're at the line, ready to throw. All of a sudden the chalker notices an error in the previous score, and reaches up to erase and correct it. Worse yet, someone behind you notices it and starts trying to get the chalker's attention to correct it.

A catchy tune comes on the juke box and the chalker starts be-bopping to the music just as you're throwing the double out shot.

Those and even worse things have happened to all of us at one time or another.

A little common sense solves the problem. When you're chalking, remember, you are in the players direct line of sight. Stand as still as possible and don't move unless the player asks you to verify the score of a dart. Remember, the player is looking straight at the board, they can see the darts easily, and most times know what the score of the dart is. There is plenty of time after the third one to lean over and look to see which side of the wire it's on. If they need your help they'll ask!

You should verbally verify the score of the throw with the player after the third dart, then post it and add or subtract. No one expects every chalker to be a math whiz, but keeping score in darts only requires adding and subtracting. You should be accurate. If in doubt, take your time.

If you are waiting your turn or not playing a game, stand behind the line. back behind the thrower's peripheral vision line. It isn't necessary to be totally silent, but sudden loud outbursts can be distracting.

If conditions require you to sit or stand beside the throwing lane, try to be still when someone is at the line.

A few helpful ideas to make you both a better player and spectator.






