

ALL-STAR TEAM


This year saw 50 men and 25 women compete for a spot on the CENTRAL OHIO ALL-STAR TEAM '92.

The weekend of November 20-21 saw well over 300 darters from around the country and Canada converge on Columbus for the 10th edition of our annual Buckeye Open Tournament.

The Friday Night Blind Draw, with 268 advocates of the short spear "toeing-the-line" was just the start of the most successful tournament we have ever staged.

C.O.D. members proved that they can match skill with some of the best. Overall, C.O.D. members won almost \$1,900 or 19% of the total purse of \$10,000.

If you haven't been to a tournament, the Buckeye is a great one to use to "get your feet wet." It's right here in Columbus the weekend before Thanksgiving every year. Plan now on attending next year. With over 300 darters gathered in one place, you know there is lots of fun to be had.



DARTING TIPS TRICKS AND TRAPS

By James Kinney Let's look at moving left or right on the toe line, a practice that can either help or hurt your game.

Here's the TIP:

As a rule of thumb, you really don't want to move around on the line unless it is absolutely necessary. Your chance of hitting the target decreases and the chance of deflection into the dart blocking the target increases. You should practice this technique before using it in competition.

Here's the TRICK:

If your normal stance is at the center of the line, moving left or right moves you away from the target. You should adjust your aim, not how hard you throw.

If you move to the left, make your point of aim 1/4 inch above the target and to the right side of the target wedge. you move to the right, aim 1/4 inch above the target and to the left side of the target wedge.

If your normal stance is away from the center and you move, you are moving closer to the target. Adjust your aim 1/4 inch lower and to the center of the target area.

These ideas aren't golden, they are just a starting point. With practice, you will find the necessary adjustments that work best for you. Try them and see if they work for you.

Here's the TRAP:

Once you start moving on the line, you will tend to get comfortable with it and do it more often. That's not always a good idea.

No matter how much you practice, two facts are true about moving on the line; If you have a dart blocking a target and you move, your chances of deflection will still increase and your accuracy will decrease considerably.

Once you get comfortable moving on the line, you might overlook obvious shots that have better accuracy and less deflection percentage.




