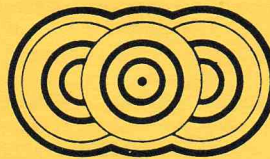

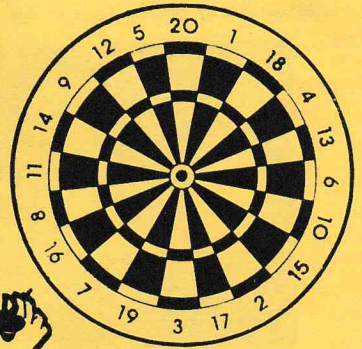

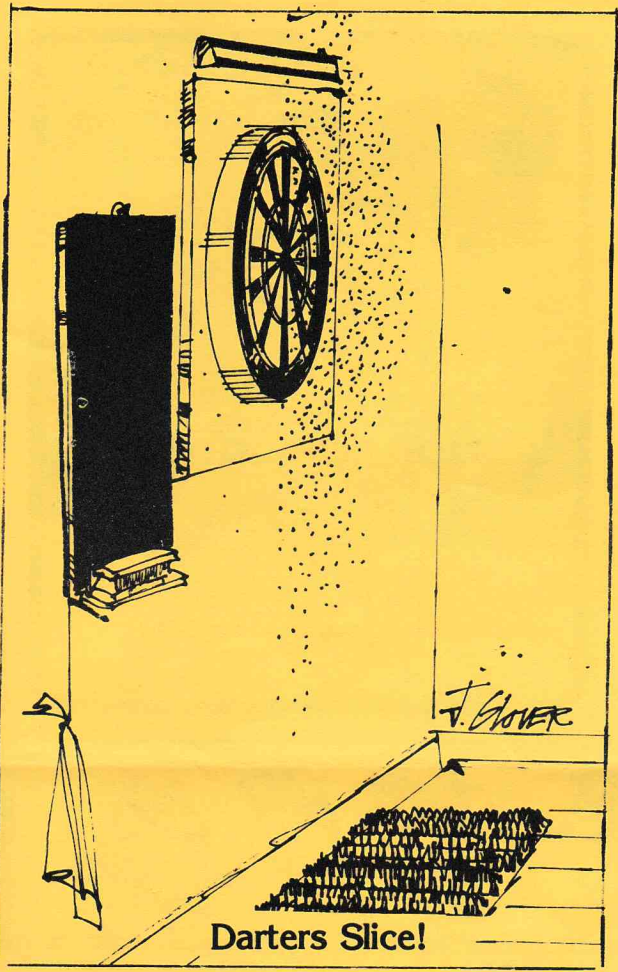
BIG BROTHERS/BIG SISTERS TOURNAMENT
