Central Ohio Darters will be sponsoring a tournament as a memorial to COD member Terry Hogan, who passed from this world suddenly on January 13th.

Terry had been a member of COD for several seasons, most recently as a member of the I Division team called The Drunks (now Hogan's Heroes). Terry and team-mates Scott Dillon, Jay Cline, and Charlie Snaith won that division during the fall 1983 season and participated in the Silver Flight playoffs.

Besides COD league play, Terry was active in local tournaments and blind draws, particularly the Wednesday night Blind Draw at the Crest Tavern.

Terry graduated from Grandview Heights High School in 1972 and was employed as a shipping clerk for Chelsea House Fabrics-Style Line Inc. He is survived by his father and mother, William and Dorothy Hogan, and sister, Deborah Griffith, all of Columbus.

Terry Hogan was a dedicated darter who will be missed by his many friends in the league. If you would like to compete in his honor, come out Friday and Saturday, March 9 and 10 to the Knights of Columbus Hall, 3077 Fisher Road. Also, the Crest Tavern will be holding its Sunday afternoon blind draw on March 11 in Terry's honor.

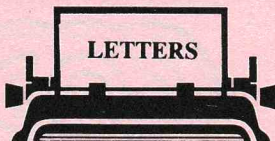

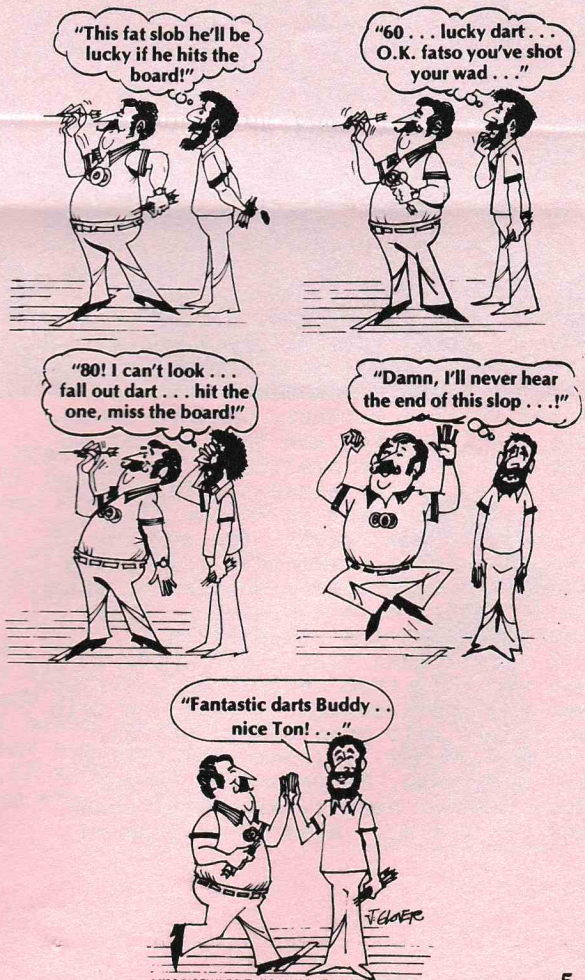

The "Aloha spirit" is sort of like the Christmas spirit in that it encourages a festive, joyful attitude in the individual and promotes a friendly feeling of communion with others. Going to Hawaii means more than just going to a place where the weather is perfect nearly every day of the year, where the ocean is there all the time to look at, listen to, and swim in (or snorkle, sail or surf). On Waikiki Beach, at least, it means entering into the Aloha spirit of things. If you add this special Attitude to the fierce spirit of competition that always prevails at major national and international dart tournaments, you will have the essence of the \$100,000 Royal Hawaiian Open.

The big names, little names, and no names in the dart world seemed to mix with greater ease than usual there. Jerry Umberger, Rick Ney and Judy Campbell (definitely big names) were feeling so friendly they even let me, Ralph R., and our Hawaiian mixed triples partner, Sanford Young, win the first leg and take a shot at the match before beating us in the 2nd round of the mixed triples competition. They went on to the finals, we went to the beach. The setting of the tournament completely eliminates the sometimes tedious problem of what to do at big dart tournaments after you're out of the competition.

I should take this opportunity to say who all, from Central Ohio Darters, was fortunate enough to make the trip to Hawaii this year (Sept. 16-26): Jay and Jeanne Tomlinson and little Ben Tomlinson, Ralph and I, Denise Green, Nancy Swartz, Mike Weilbacher and Jim Medley. Most of us planned

the trip for months, but Medley's was something of a last minute decision. I don't think he's sorry. In fact, he told me he wouldn't have come back if he hadn't just signed a year's lease on his apartment. We were all happy to have him along. Mike Weilbacher evidently needed the inspiration of going to Hawaii to throw his first ever T-80 (in the Open Singles event). The best part is that he had said on the plane going over that he wanted to do just that.

The tournament itself was first class all the way. It was so far beyond being a well-run tournament that it is useless to compare it to any other. The fact that it lasted for a week rather than just a weekend is a major difference. The extra touches were abundant. The hall decorations were elaborate and artistic, making it a pleasure just to go to the tournament hall each day. The opening ceremony was a combination pep rally for the sport of darts and the giving of a blessing over the week's events. There was a mid-week luau, a candle-lit awards banquet that included a multi-media slide show of the week's happenings (Denise and I both were in it) and, of course, the staged finals. A fellow named Ken Mason, an Irishman transplanted to California, did a seemingly impossible thing and made it to the finals in all four of his events. He won two of the finals (including OPEN SINGLES) and lost two and took home almost \$20,000. This man lost only two matches the whole week.



I don't have the space to tell you about the Rock-n-Roll Booze Cruise, the Rose and Crown bar with the "sing-a-long" piano player, the great Japanese food or the eery magnificence of those gigantic skyscrapers lighting up at night right on the beach. Or how much fun we had just being regular tourists shopping for Hawaiian dresses and shirts. (Medley seems to be getting real good mileage out of his).

A long time ago I heard someone say about a place they had visited that it was more a state of mind than a place, and now I know exactly what they meant. Aloha!

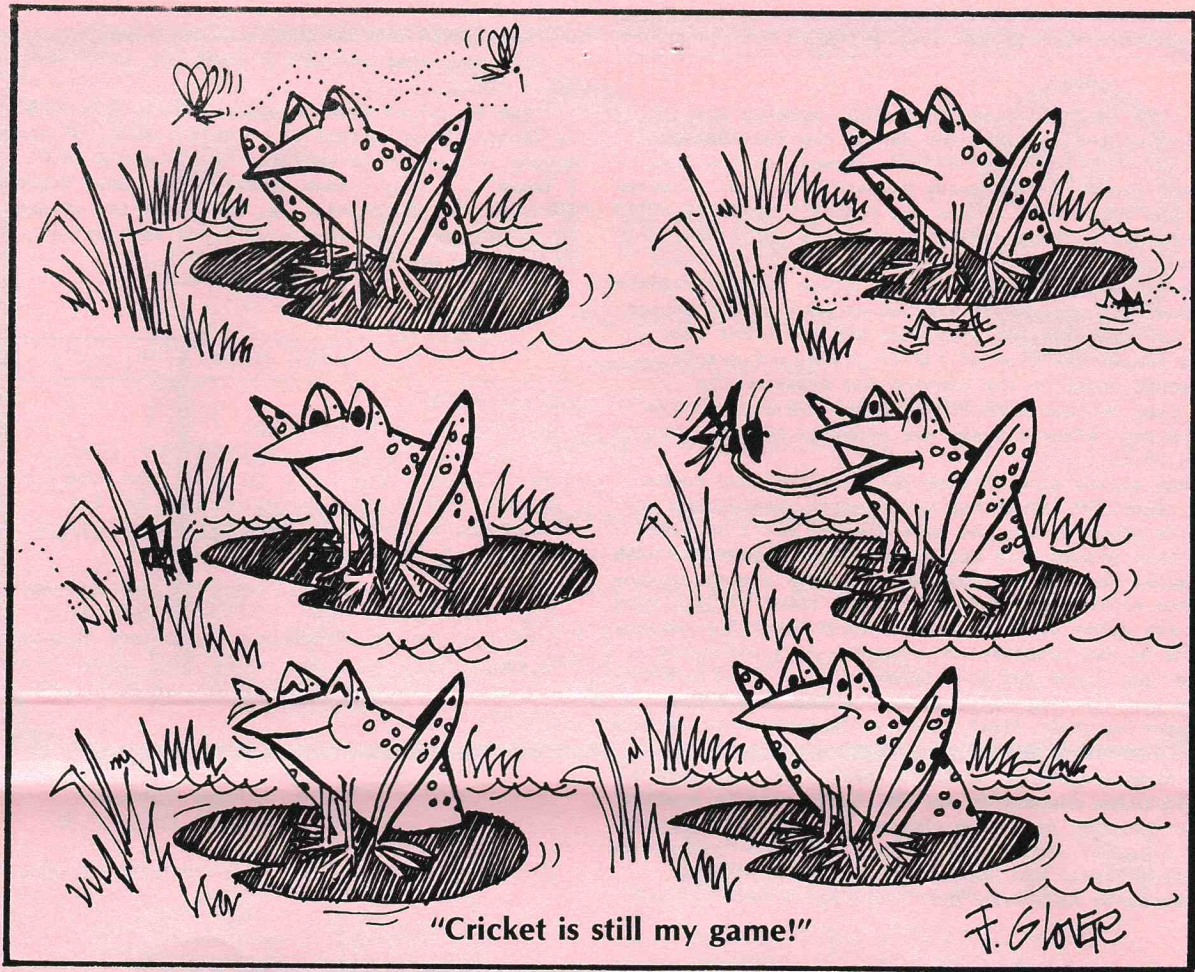
- A motion was passed allowing any willing candidate who received 3 or more nominations to be placed on the board election ballot.
- It was reported that ADO dues are due.
- It was announced that COD's approximated net from the Buckeye Open was \$400.00.
- Tom announced that some of our current member bars will be dropped for the Winter '84 season unless they make improvements and that he has new bars that would like to get in for the new season.
- Shirley announced that the ad contract has been updated and revised and copies will be available soon.
- The possibility of starting the All-Star Team Qualifiers for the Quad-City Challenge as early as summer was discussed.
- A motion was passed to accept the Flight Championship Playoff format as follows: A round robin consisting of one 501 doubles game and one Cricket doubles game for a total of two points per round. In case of a tie - best 2 of 3 801 team games will be used.

- The OSU Dart League requested permission to adopt our rules and by-laws for their league. The board suggested they use them and revise them to meet their needs. There was a consensus to allow the OSU Dart League to use COD's rules and by-laws and to encourage co-operation between the two leagues.
