# QUAD CITY CHALLENGE 1984

So you wanna be a star. . . Why not be an All-Star? Try out for this once-a-year opportunity to be part of a dart team that will represent the city of Columbus against the best that Cleveland, Cincinnati and Dayton have to offer. The Quad-City Challenge is scheduled for Sunday, November 18 from 1-5 pm, the same weekend as the COD sponsored Buckeye Open Tournament (watch for details of the tourney itself in the near future.)

The Columbus All-Star Team will consist of 24 men (+ 4 subs) and 12 women (+ 2 subs). Qualifiers for the team will run throughout the month of September. (See schedule below). There is a \$2 fee for each attempt you make and you may attempt to qualify as many times as you wish. Money raised will buy shirts for the team. Here is the format:

You will throw 3 games of 501 Double-In/Double Out, then average your total number of darts per game. Dates, places and times are:

I would like to welcome everyone back to darts for the Fall Season. I hope you haven't gotten too rusty over the summer.

This event came about mainly through the efforts of Bill Lodge, Commissioner of Darts in Hamilton, Ontario CANADA and COD's Mike Weilbacher who met last year in Hawaii and had been planning something like this ever since.

The Canadians arrived in town on Friday, Aug 3, warmed up with an impromptublind draw at the Crest Tavern, got a good nights sleep in the homes of various COD members, and came to the party ready to challenge the Americans to a dart match. Challenge they did; win they did not. COD members defeated them 5 matches to 3. They didn't go home empty-handed, however. Commissioner Bill Lodge and his partner Susan Haddow took 2nd Place in the regularly-scheduled mixed doubles event, as did Bill (with CODers Denise Green and Tom Taylor) in the mixed triples event.

8 COD members were chosen to play matches against the 8 attending Canadians. It went down to the wire. The last match to finish was between Barb Lindeman (Canada) and Gayle Querin. With the score at 4-3 our favor, Gayle kept the match from going into a tie situation by sinking a double 3 to win her match and the challenge. Perhaps Gayle felt extra incentive to pull through for us that day because it was her last COD event for quite some time. She was leaving the next day for her new home in Germany. What a way to end it, Gayle!



In July they accomplished something only a few married couples in the league have, capturing the Open and Ladies Singles titles at the same tournament. 
