



BOARD TAKES MAJOR STEP TOWARD FUTURE GROWTH AND PROSPERITY OF C.O.D.!

Upon recommendation of the Planning Committee, and after extensive consideration of all of the ramifications, your Board of Directors elected to create a paid staff position, the *Coordinator*.

Our By-Laws are being revised to include this office, and the responsibilities will include:

- Directing the day-to-day operations of the organization in an appropriate business-like fashion.
- Maintain accurate membership information and league statistics, and report same on a regular basis.
- Coordinate registration and scheduling for all leagues.
- Edit the Newsletter and be responsible for its production and distribution.
- Develop ongoing communication programs to increase direct membership in the organization as well as broaden participation in affiliate organizations.
- Maintain the organization's business office.
- Serve as the representative to the American Darts Organization.

That's right, this person will have a lot of responsibilities. The Board believes that a paid staff person, dedicated to the everyday affairs of C.O.D. is essential, if we are to maintain and improve our level of services to members and the various leagues we offer, as well as grow in the future.


It is important to note that this will not be a Board position. It likewise will not lessen any Board member's resposibilities. In fact we anticipate that with improved efficiency, the Board will have even more work to do.

These are exciting times for C.O.D.! Services to you, our members, will be dramatically improved and everyone will benefit.

We will finally have regular "office hours". That includes someone available to answer the phone and handle day-to-day business on a part-time basis. All of our leagues will be coordinated in a professional manner. There will be timely, and accurate dissemination of information. That includes to you as well as the community at large.

It opens the door for expansion of our organization and allows for more, as well as a greater variety of offerings for everyone.

The Board is excited about this major step toward the future. If you are interested in applying for this part-time position, send your resume immediately! Interviews will take place in July, and the position filled by August 1.

The ADO All-Star qualifiers were held in Dayton June 8. Representing C.O.D. were Luann Laughery and Randy Morrow, Singles Winners in the President's Tournament, and Kim Kellar, Jim Brown and Gary Covey who were winners in our April 25 qualifier. This playoff picks the men and women from our region who travel to Las Vegas for the annual East/West All Star Challenge August 18.

PACIFIC CUP

Columbus' own Kim Kellar had quite a marathon in this playoff. There was a 3-way tie after the first round, and she had to beat Kathy Maloney and Julie Bathington, two of the top women in the country. The next round saw her tied with two other nationally ranked women, Terri Marcello and Laurie Braithwaite. True to form, she came through and beat them in what was a marathon day of darts. Kim joins Eve Grigsby, Paul Lim and Dave Kelly on a trip to Singapore for the Pacific Cup Tournament in October.

MASTERS PLAYOFF

City Champs Debra Lewis and Steve Market, along with Luann Laughery have qualified to represent C.O.D. at the ADO Masters Playoffs. We are ready to add one or more divisions this Fall. START PLANNING NOW!


If you know of a tavern/playing site that is interested in this "tavern v. tavern" type league, get in touch with them immediately and start getting a team together.

FEATURE DARTER KIM KELLAR By Becky Roberts



Kim Kellar is going to Singapore to represent the U.S. in the Pacific Cup International Darts Championship. Kim won a series of qualifying events to make it to the finals held April 20 in Cincinnati. She and Eva Grigsby won that round-robin tournament, giving them the opportunity to be the women representing the U.S. in one of the three most pretigious events in our sport.

Kim became interested in our game while dating a darter. She started playing at the Bier Stube and competing in some local blind draws. Although she has always been a good athlete (3 year scholarship basketball player at Indiana State), Kim feels her success is due to hard work at practice. She also credits learning out shots and strategy to Roger Fannin, who took an interest in helping her learn the game early in her career.


On non-league days Kim follows several practice routines that take about two hours. She also plays one-on-one with darters who can give her a competitive game. Besides playing in both C.O.D. and ESDL, Kim also plays in the Columbus Pro League, which she views as the toughest competition in town. You'll often see her at blind draws around town. Already on her third set of darts, Kim choice of weapons is 25 gm Hammerheads.

Joining C.O.D. in Summer '88, she teamed up with John Lund in Mixed Doubles. She has since played on the Magic team in Fall and Winter, and with Gary Covey for the Summer of '89 and '90. Kim played in the ESDL last Winter in order to get best-of-3 experience. Her plans are to play on a C.O.D. team this Fall. Kim has won of our 15th week singles tournaments, including the first one she ever played!

Her tournament record is impressive; in 1989 she played in 36 and took 1st or 2nd in 24 events. She pocketed \$6014 in winnings, and was ranked 6th among women in A.D.O. earnings that year. So far in 1990, she is ranked 3rd and has surpassed her '89 earnings, placing 1st or 2nd in 22 events in 16 tournaments. Some of you may have seen her in Lexington this year at the "Easy Money Open", where she walked away with \$1200, winning EVERY event she entered. Not Bad!

Kim attends all major out-of-town tournaments. Going it alone now, she was sponsored by Sisapa for a time. Every weekend this year she has been in either a tournament, qualifier or other dart event of some sort. Even when she worked full time, Kim kept up with her practice routine and played every night. She views the singles events as her best challenge.

Kim's advice to anyone who wants to make a career out of darts, or just become more competitive is simple - PRACTICE and challenge yourself by asking a better player for a match one-on-one. She will be out playing a lot, and gearing up for the Pacific Cup in October. We wish her the best of luck. Knowing Kim and her darts, she probably won't need it.



ALL-STAR QULAIFIERS

It's time once again to select the Columbus All-Star Team.

This team plays against Cleveland, Concinnati and Dayton in the annual *Quad-City Challenge on Sun. Nov. 18.* Last year we were runner-up.

The team will consist of 28 men and 14 women, and will be chosen from throughout Central Ohio. We will have a series of qualifiers this fall to pick the team.

There is no limit to the number of times you may try to qualify. The cost is \$2 per try, and this goes toward defraying the cost of our unique team shirts. There is no membership requirement to qualify, but you must live within a 50 mile radius of Columbus.

Rnd 1 - 501 S/I-D/O total darts thrown

Rnd 2 - 501 S/I-D/O total darts thrown

Rnd 3 - 3 darts at each double,


mnumbers 1 thru 20 and bulls. Each double counts one point.

TRAVEL AND SCHEDULING

I live near Sawmill, how come we always get scheduled out at Gahanna Lanes at least once a season? I live in Clintonville and have to play at the Blue Moon on Sullivant? Why can't schedules be set up to cut down on travel?

All of us have had similar questions from time to time. The answers are not simple but perhaps an explanation of some underlying principles of our league will help.

C.O.D. was founded on the primary principle that darts should be fun. In striving to maintain that idea, we have always tried to set up divisions so they are competitive in and of themselves. (Pro sports call it parity.)

Doing this doesn't allow for "home" bars, so we have treated our playing sites as a pool of boards. Where you are scheduled is primarily a matter of the random sequence the boards are placed in.

We try to arrange things so that teams aren't always driving a long away, but that's not always possible.

Keep in mind that your teammates may live in different parts of the city too. Which person do we pick to key to? The captain is the logical one, but they may not live or work near other team members!

We are working on a system to divide the city into areas. If it is 4, then you would play 3 weeks in each of 4 and 2 weeks would be pot-luck. That's complicated by the fact that we have varying numbers of boards in each area of the city.

In short, it ain't easy! However, be assured we are aware of this concern, and we are attempting to work out solutions that will hopefully please everyone. No promises for Fall Season, but we'll try.

WHAT AM I PAYING FOR?

This is an excellent question, and one that we probably haven't answered sufficiently for a long time.

Your dues goes for several things. This newsletter is one. Parties don't just happen, they need to be paid for and dues goes toward that. C.O.D. is a member of the American Darts Organization, the national organization for our sport, and a portion of your dues goes toward the dues we pay to belong.


Team fees cover several items. Standing sheets is the primary one. Think what just the postage is to send them out every week. On top of that they have to be copied, along with schedules and other information each season. Scorecards and Rule Books must be printed.


Are you aware that all of our playing sites pay dues to belong to C.O.D.?


