We're almost at the end of another Summer, the time darters start thinking about the upcoming Fall Season.



That will be the word of the day as we all "Tee-Off" in this annual event that lets us dream we're one of the big hitters on the PGA Tour:

C.O.D. GOLF-DART OPEN IV

You can't beat the Greens Fees, and you won't need a cart! In fact, we'll even throw in the food and liquid refreshments so necessary to quench that parched pallet and hearty appetite brought on by a long day on the links.

The rules are simple. You play up to 3 darts at each number 1 thru 18, in order. A Single is Par (even), a Triple's a Birdie (-1) and a Double's an Eagle (-2). Miss the number and it's a Bogey (+1). Land outside the Double ring, and you score a Double Bogey (+2) The last dart thrown is your score. That's right, you can stop after 1 or 2 and take that score if you like.

Everyone will play 2 rounds (36 "holes"). We'll then have a "Cut" to the top 1/2 (plus ties). Scores for the first 2 rounds will be voided, and these survivors will play 2 more rounds. If there's a tie after the next 36 "holes", there will be a sudden death playoff on 19, 20, 1, etc. to determine the winner and places.

Can you think of a better way to spend a hot, humid August day than in the air conditioned comfort of the Grotto in the company of dart players? We'll have the usual assortment of delicious stuff to eat, as well as appropriate liquid refreshments throughout the day.

As always, this party is free to all current C.O.D. members and this time your adult guests are on us! Please remember, darts is an adult sport and this is an adult party.

ALL-STAR TEAM QUALIFYING RULES

Qualification for the 1995 Central Ohio All-Star Team will take on a whole new look when it starts in in early September.

By popular request, and in a effort to field the most competitive team possible, the format has been totally revamped. A lot of thought and time has gone into this, and we're thankful to the committee who did so.

Here's all of the "Technical" stuff!

SIZE OF THE TEAM:

First and foremost, Players and alternates will be defined. There will be 24 Men Players and 4 Alternates. The Women will have 12 and 2. We'll also have a Team Manager appointed by the All—Star Committee, and 2 Coaches appointed by the Manager with approval by the committee..

WHO CAN QUALIFY:-

The team is open to anyone who lives within a 50 mile radius of Columbus. Oh yea, you also must be in a league that has at least 350 members, or is ADO affiliated, or is otherwise recognized by the C.O.D. Board of Directors as eligible to place people on the team. Or, you must be otherwise recognized by C.O.D. to be eligible for the team.

EARNED SPOTS:*

You can get an automatic spot on the team as a Player by doing any one of the following:

- 1. Win the C.O.D. Winter or Spring Party Singles
- 2. Win the C.P.L. Singles Events
- Win another recognized league's End of Season Singles or equivalent
- Advance beyond the Regional Level in ADO Regional Singles Playoffs
- 5. Finish in an ADO Sanctioned Tournament Singles: \$5,000+ 1st \$10,000+ 1st or 2nd \$20,000+ top 4

Doubles: \$20,000+ 1st

OPEN QUALIFIERS:

Anyone who meets the criteria listed under ""Who Can Qualify" is eligible and encouraged to attempt to qualify for the team through the Open Qualifier format.

ROUND 1:

ENTRY FEE \$5 PER ATTEMPT

Men: You'll play 4 games of 501 SI/DO and add up your total darts. Then, it's a shot at 26 3-dart out combinations (65-90). You subtract 2 for each 3-dart combo you hit The top 20, less the number who make the team via Earned Spots, are on the Team as Players.

Women: You'll play 3 games of 501 Si/DO and add up your total darts. Your 26 3-dart outs are 45-70, subtracting 2 for each one hit. The top 10, less the number who make the team via Earned Spots, are on the Team as Players.

ROUND 2:

The top 16 Men and top 8 Women who didn't make the team from Round 1 will face off in a Double— Elimination Bracket to determine the last 4 Men and 2 Women to make the Team as Players, and the 4 and 2 who make the team as Alternates.

There are 10 Open Qualifier Round 1 dates scheduled on Saturdays and Sundays. Round 2 is scheduled for Sunday Oct 10.

Round 2 Qualifier - Sunday October 10.

* If a person qualifies for the team via an Earned Spot, it is that person's responsibility to notify the C.O.D. Coordinator in a timely fashion. Such notification must be accompanied by additional verification such as a copy of publication in the ADO DOUBLE EAGLE or other such reporting media such as BULL"S-EYE NEWS, or a signed statement from the tournament director. If it as a result of another league's End of Season Party (or equiv), verification must be in the form of a signed statement from the league president or other responsible officer. If the event is sponsored by C.O.D., the player is not responsible for reporting the result. C.O.D. will take responsibility for such reporting

Qualification Period for 1995 team is the 1994 Buckeye Open through the ADO Masters Regional Playoffs, August 27. Qualification period for future years begins the weekend after ADO Masters Regional Playoffs through the succeeding year's ADO Masters Regional Playoff.

The Central Ohio Board of directors, in consultation with the All-star Team Committee, reserves that right to make modifications and/or changes to this qualification process as may required both for 1995 and the future

TEAM SPONSORSHIP

A POSITION STATEMENT
Adopted by Board of Directors October 1989

The C.O.D. Board of Directors does not wish to encourage or discourage sponsorship of teams or members playing in its leagues. Sponsorship arrangements should be left solely to the discretion of the parties involved.

However, the Board does feel very strongly that a team or member seeking sponsorship has an obligation to fully explain to the potential sponsor exactly what they are being asked to pay for.

Specifically, this relates to Membership Dues. Since your Dues makes you a member of C.O.D. for the full year (or remaining part), regardless of whether you play during a given league or season, your potential sponsor should be made aware of this fact, if you are asking them to pay your Membership Dues.

The Board hereby goes on record as not endorsing sponsors paying individual Membership Dues as part of a sponsorship arrangement. It feels that individual members should pay their own Dues. At the same time, this does not prohibit sponsors from paying individual Membership Dues if they so wish.

The Board has received comments and complaints that \$225 (5 people Dues & Team Fees) is a lot to pay to sponsor a team. It does not wish to hear such comments/complaints in the future.

Future or continued abuse of your obligation to fully explain to a potential sponsor exactly what they are paying for may result in a sponsorship disclosure statement having to be signed by sponsors. That's just an unnecessary bureaucratic step that none of us want. Let's all be fair and up front with those who sponsor teams!

ADO MIXED TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS!

That's right, something new from ADO! Starting this Fall, There will be a Regional Playoff for a Mixed Team Championship. The winner of the Region (1 for each 8 entries) goes on to the National Mixed Team Championship to be held in January 1996 in Houston, Texas.

C.O.D. will send at least 1 mixed team to the Regional Playoff! That's right, we're putting up the \$270 entry fee to send at least 1 team. We'll have a playoff on Oct 7 to determine who. The entry fee is \$30 per team. If we have 9 or more teams, we'll send 2 to the Regional.

The exact format is still in the works, but we'll follow the ADO Regional format as closely as possible. Teams must be male/female mixed, but you can do it any way you like.

The Regional Playoff date is not set yet, but will be between Nov 17 & Dec 1. This new event promises to be a lot of fun. We encourage you to start putting a team together NOW, so you're ready on Oct 7!

Congratulations to Liz Blevins (Smith) on winning the Region IV-1 All Star Playoffs! She's off to Las Vegas on August 11 to play in the East-West All Star Challenge, with a shot at making the National Singles Championships. We wish Liz a bunch of great darts as she competes against some of the best the country has to offer.

On the men's side, Roger Roush represented us well in the All Star Regional. There wasn't much any of the men could do with G.R. Verner from Pittsburgh. He went undefeated in 9 matches, winning 23 of 27 games!

The next Regional event is August 26. Mick Owens and Liz Blevins, City Champs will represent us in the World Masters Regional Playoffs. Wish them well as the step up to the ochre competing for a trip to New York and the chance to play in the National Finals for a trip to London in December.

YOUTH PROGRAM STARTS THIS FALL

Our Youth Program gets underway in early October!

The plan is to hold this program over the course of 8 weeks. The first 2 weeks will be devoted to a clinic format, focusing on proper etiquette, technique and beginning strategies for both "01" and Cricket. we'll have a host of adult guidance to work with young people of different skill levels.

The remaining weeks will be devoted to league play. The exact format will be dependent on the turnout we have. We'll provide appropriate awards at the end of the "season".

The clinics and league play will be held on Saturday, starting in early October. The exact start date, location and time is a little "up in the air" only because we aren't sure at press time what locations will be available this Fall. As soon as these details are nailed down, we'll let you know.

We ask that there be a parent or guardian (or responsible adult) present for each young person participating. The program will be about 2 hours each week. There will be a nominal \$5 registration fee, and parents/guardians will be asked to sign release and permission slips in order for their children to participate. This program is open to any youth between the ages of 6 and 17.

This promises to be a fun time for youth and adults alike, and will provide a forum for our youth to increase their skills and earn just how much fun our favorite sport can be.

HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVES

Ever have "one of those days"? We thought you might enjoy this historical tidbit, reprinted from February 1982 issue of DART NEWS.

WASN'T THAT A PARTY....Riverview CC 1982

Records, Records, and More Records...,and WHY NOT! After all, it has been good a year for the C.O.D. and its membership. As the song goes "wasn't that a party..." and indeed, it was.

More members and guests attended this party than ever before. Official counts show 269 members and 58 guests were present. But, because of the record setting cold that partially froze half of the Riverview Country Club interior, and the dart room in particular, we suspect that a lot more than 327 people packed themselves into the event. Conservatively, there were over 400 people present, and a lot of them didn't even know we had a registration table!

We do know that we had ordered food for 300, and twice had to ask the crew from Sisters Chicken to have additional food brought in from their nearest store.

For those members who did not venture out on the coldest day of this century, here is a capsule of what happened.

Friday January 6, 1982:

7:00 PM - First sign of trouble as the night before set up crew arrives at Riverview Country Club. The manager informs us that the heat in the "dart" room is malfunctioning and will have to be repaired. He assures us that all will be well by show time on Saturday. Board members an volunteers guesstimated the room to be about -5 degrees. Set-up goes well despite cold.

Saturday January 7, 1982

11:00 AM - Arrival of first volunteers brings word that the repairman has been unable to get there, but is "on his way". Dart room temperature about 7 below, and falling. Maybe no one will show up and we won't have to pay for the hall.

12:00 Noon - First members and guests arrive. Several phone calls to repair man have brought the usual "he's on his way" promises.

12:20 PM - Nearly 100 people have already arrived. Due to frigid situation in dart room, and absence of Registrar (cold weather car problems), start of first event pushed back to 2:00. Another call to the repair man gets same answer. Inside temperature now 10 below, while it's -19 outside and falling!

12:45 PM - Nearly 200 people have arrived for the 1st event. Beer in "dart" room must be moved to interior of building to prevent freezing. Plenty of volunteers for that. All windows in the building are frozen and, of course, the repair man "is on his way". President and Board of Directors discuss emergency move of 20 easels and boards to in interior of building (where there is some heat)... They secretly fear for their lives. Registration is opened.

12:55 PM - Manager informs us that we have just tapped our 4th keg... oh yes, he has personally talked to the repair man and we have nothing to worry about. (He is obviously not a darter) the more than 200 people present are told that 1st event will start at 2:00 (1 hour late) and that a decision as to what to do will be made at 1:30 since, after all the repair man "is on his way", and as manager said, HE had nothing to worry about. (What? still no complaints from anyone?)

1:12 PM - In a last ditch effort, a few members volunteer to go outside and see if they can figure out how to kick the furnace in the right place. They return unsucessful and reporting that naturally, the repair man is no where to be seen... He most assuredly in on his way!

1:45 PM - Decision made to move easels to interior room with as little damage as possible. Thanks to group of volunteers this more takes only 23 minutes. It's now -20 outside. Registration for the Blind Draw has reached 160. Will be left open until 2:15 or until easels moved and set up. Still no complaints, only cooperation!

2:30 PM - "Blind Draw of the Century" gets underway 1-1/2 hours late, with 196 entries. Still no repair man. Still no complaints!

4:40 PM Repair man arrives. Lives of Board members are no longer considered in danger. Crowded conditions have brought no complaints, but Board Members realize that the scheduled Mixed Triples event cannot be held in such cramped quarters. Furnace in back room comes on! Decision is made to move easels back into large room while dinner is being served. Great group of

volunteers to do so. Prayers are said for the furnace.

5:00 PM - Food arrives from Sisters Chicken. Heat in back room is on. We're almost back on schedule.

5:30 PM - Dinner is served on time! Heat in back room has risen to almost 60 degrees,

6:00 PM - All-Star Team picture is taken on schedule! Easels are moved back to the main room in preparation for the main event, Mixed Triples. Registration opens only 1 hour late. Still no complaints!

6:15 PM - Complaint is received! President is confronted by unknow darter who wants to know why we didn't get the Renzetti's menu from last year's Summer party. Note, this person was in midst of devouring 5 pieces of Sisters chicken, double helping of biscuits, gravy, cole slaw and rice. (Had probably already eaten the baked beans.)

6:20 PM sisters manager informs us that we have more than 75 people in line with only enough food for 30. He's asked to order more!

6:30 PM - Trophies and awards are given out on time! Sisters tells us that we're still short of food... more ordered. We've now tapped our 13th keg... we had ordered only 10. He's told to keep it flowing if he can. Meanwhile, we've already sent someone out to purchase nearly 3 times the amount of snacks that have ever been consumed at at a party.

6:45 PM - Registration closes for the Triples ... 1 hour late. By this time all of the easels are back in the main room and we're set to go. Only 35 minutes behind schedule!

6:50 PM - 1st round of Triples is called.

7:00 PM - Unannounced door prizes are given out. This probably spared the lives of the Board Members present.

10:35 - We're now into our 15th keg. The furnace goes out!

11:20 PM - Number 16 an 17 are tapped!

11:40 PM - Remaining players in Triples are beginning to see their breath, and start asking questions. They aren't angry, just cold!

Sunday January 8, 1992

12:45 AM - We have reached the saturation point! Only 1 more will be tapped and the coffee is put on. 8 teams remain in Triples, but their progress is hampered by having to throw darts with their gloves or other pieces of clothing on their hands. Board members gladly give up their jackets and sweaters to help the "sports" who remain. They huddle together to keep warm. Still no complaints!

1:30 AM - Mixed Triples is over! The outside temperature has dropped to 26 below! No one can bear to look to see how cold it is inside. Eight of the finalists remain to help break down the equipment. (It will be picked up and returned to storage the next day.

2:00 AM - Party and Riverview Country Club are closed! Everyone's car starts without a problem! Still, no complaints!




