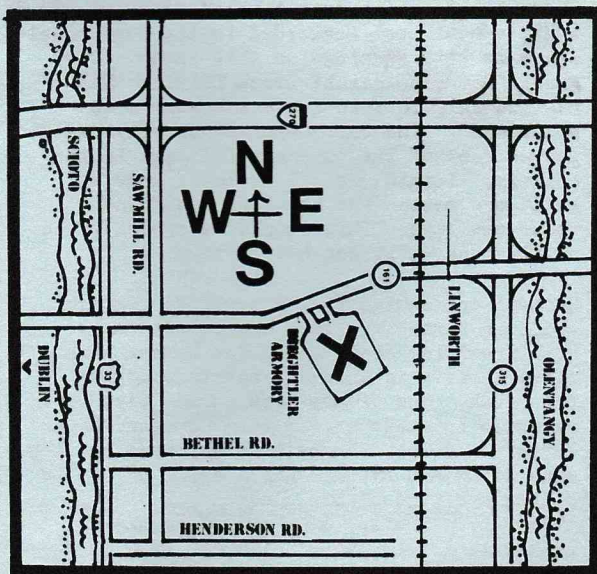
- 12:30 p.m. Men's Singles

## President's message.

Since this is my first President's Letter, I thought I would take the opportunity to speak to two serious issues confronting the league. These issues are sportsmanship and drinking & driving.

What is sportsmanship? Webster defines it as "qualities and behavior befitting a sportsman." What does that mean? I think everybody probably has a little different viewpoint, so I'll give you mine. Sportsmanship is shaking hands with your opponent before and after a match, and meaning it. Sportsmanship is allowing your opponent to throw without distraction from you, your teammates, or the chalk. Sportsmanship is maintaining self-control and not yelling an expletive at the top of your lungs when you miss a shot. Sportsmanship is throwing your darts only at the board - not at the ceiling, wall, table, or floor. Sportsmanship is being a gracious winner and a good loser. I think everybody needs to re-examine their behavior during a dart match and think a little more about sportsmanship.

The other issue is drinking and driving. We seem to have been bombarded in the past couple of years with warnings on this issue. The group "Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD)" has led an effort to raise everyone's consciousness. The Ohio General Assembly has passed some of the toughest DWI laws in the country. I think we all probably know at least one person who has been cited under those new laws. This should be enough to let us all know - "it can happen to me".

Darters are a high risk group. We play our sport in bars. The bars are usually not within walking distance of our homes. Sometimes we have to drive across town to get to the match. One of the more common ways to reward a teammate's good throw or game is to buy him a drink. I don't think there are too many of us who haven't had a drink or two to steady our hand before a match. I also don't think there are too many of us who haven't gotten behind the wheel of a car when we probably shouldn't have.

The intent of this is by no means to preach against drinking. Rather I just want to urge everyone to be cautious and use a little common sense. The attitude of the police and courts is no longer one of tolerance. Everyone needs to be aware and responsible not only for themselves but of their teammates and friends. We don't want to lose any of you, so let's be careful out there.

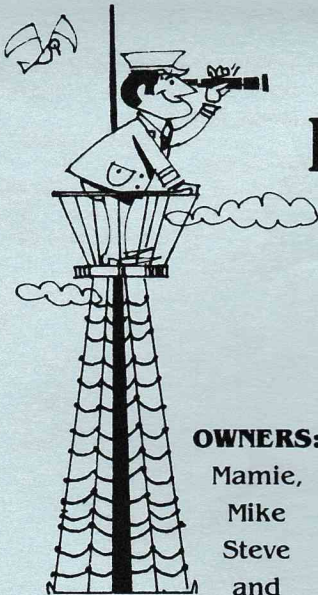
Deadline for summer season registration is the End of Season Party, May 31st for hand-delivered registration or postmarked by May 30th.

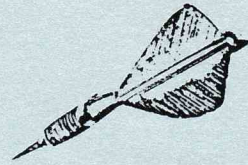

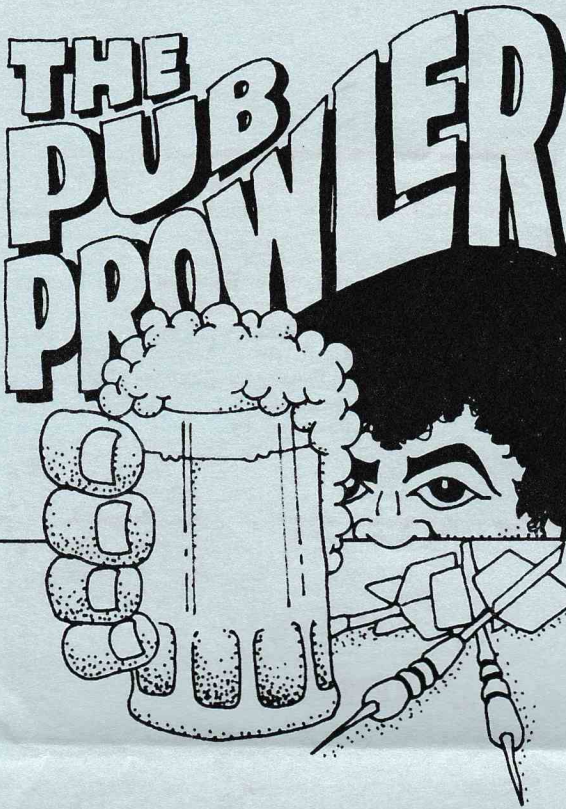

It's time again for another brief roundup on a couple more C.O.D. bars. Before I start I would like to mention a couple of items pertaining to the establishments where we throw. First, if anyone knows of a bar that is interested in hosting C.O.D. play, please send a note with the bar's name, phone number and the name of the owner to: C.O.D./P. O. Box 14109/Columbus, OH 43214/ATTN: Bar Relations. The second item pertains to the bar evaluations forms. If you have a problem with a bar, please fill out the form and mail it that night. Hassling the waitress or bartender will accomplish very little. Thanks for your support.

Now on to the review!

This week we're going to take a look at the Olentangy Inn and Park Place.

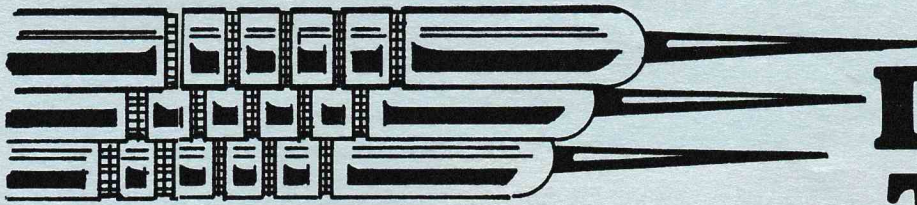
The Olentangy Inn is located at 1299 Olentangy River Road and managed by Grace Anderson. The Inn has 4 easles (made by Greg Smith, a C.O.D. member) which are set off from the main bar traffic, allowing

ample space for throwing. The boards are open for play anytime. Just ask the bartender on duty to put up a board. The bar is open Monday thru Saturday from 4 p.m. to 2:30 a.m., and starting Memorial Day it will be open on Saturday and Sunday from 1 p.m. to 2:30 a.m. When the weather decides to stay warm, the Inn will open its poolside bar with the same hours. The bar has specials from 4 - 9 p.m. on Tuesday (Schnapps), Wednesday (Ladies Night) and Thursday (Beer). The Inn is also considering running a blind draw on Thursdays. Every Friday and Saturday night there is live entertainment with cover charges ranging from 0 - \$2.00. The bands play from 9 p.m. - 2 a.m. and there is a large dance floor. For those of us who have one too many, the Inn has a 24-hour coffee shop and rooms for sleeping off that last beer.

Our second featured bar is located in the Continent at 6312 Busch Boulevard in the building previously occupied by the Crazy Horse. This new addition to the league, Park Place, is run by Tim Shaad and offers a variety of entertainment. Park Place is split into two areas - to the left are the bar and the dining room and to the right is the Comedy Club which includes the darting area. The darting area has two boards which are available everyday from noon til 6 p.m. The Comedy Club has entertainment Wednesday through Saturday which begins at 8:30 or 9:00 p.m. There is a cover charge at these times ranging from \$2.00 for amateur night on Wednesday to \$6.00 on Friday and Saturday night for one of two shows. Darters showing their membership cards will get in for 1/2 price on Thursday night. All shows require reservations which are taken Monday thru Friday from 5 - 8:00 p.m. The dining area serves a full menu from 11 a.m. to midnight on Sunday thru Thursday. Entertainment is offered on Friday and Saturday nights when the dining room is open until 1:00 a.m. There's never a cover charge in the bar and dining area. Starting in May Park Place will open its two patios with a Sunday Bar-B-Que and entertainment.

Well the pen is running out of ink so until next time, make good sportsmanship the rule to follow.





# DART TIPS

BARRELS, SHAFTS AND FLIGHTS

Besides the physical and mental aspects involved in the sport of darts, the equipment that you use must also be examined to insure quality and performance.

To begin, the barrel of the dart must be selected with certain considerations in mind, such as the weight, barrel size, and type of grip. Since darts can range in weight from 13 grams to 32 grams, be sure to try several weights to find which is easiest for you to control. Generally speaking, a heavier dart will be easier to control for a beginning dart shooter, because the weightier dart will not be as easily affected by a flaw in delivery or follow through. Gradually, as you progress in your ability you may want to move to a lighter dart, as this will force you to be more consistent in your throw. Barrel size is all a matter of feel. Make sure the barrel is comfortable and accommodates your hand.

The darts will also be available in two types of grips, grooved or knurled. Deciding between the two grips is also a matter of feel. Just make sure the grip is secure. You do not want a dart that is always slipping out of your hand.

Now that you have selected the type of dart you wish to use, let's examine the different types of accessories you will need. At the next junction of the dart is the shaft. The shaft threads into the back of the dart and serves two purposes. The first purpose is to help determine the speed of the dart, and the second is to serve as a mounting for the flights you will choose.

Shafts are available in many styles, lengths, and materials. But the most important aspect to consider when selecting shafts is the length. The length of the shaft will determine how fast your dart will travel to the

dartboard. Longer shafts will slow the dart down and shorter shafts will speed the dart up. To determine which type you should use, you must also consider how the shaft will work in conjunction with the type of flights you use.

Flights also are available in many styles and shapes. There are three (3) basic shapes of flights and two (2) types of styles. The three basic shapes are standard (full size), teardrop, and coal cracker (cut down). Full size or standard flights will give your darts more stability, but due to their size, will cause more wind resistance and slow your darts down.

Basically, the larger the flight, the more control available, but speed is lost. Smaller flights increase speed but lose the stability.

So, now having a basic understanding of what the different types of flights and shafts do, you're saying, "But how do I know what is best for me?"

Well, the trial and error method is the best way to find out. Put the emphasis on performance first. Do not let aesthetics get in the way of performance. Patience is a virtue and must be practiced fully when you are trying to determine the right combination for you. Try as many different combos as you can, and you will eventually come up with the right mix. Just like a recipe, everybody likes something a little different.

So, let's go over the basics again. Choose a barrel in a weight that is easy to control and grip. Then experiment with different flights and shafts to find out which combination gives you the most accuracy. And, finally, be patient; you can't expect miracles overnight.

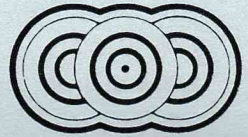
