
NEW MASTERS LEAGUE

If any of you C.O.D. members are very serious about improving your dart game and are ready for tough, lengthy competition - think about the new C.O.D. Masters League. This new league is having its initiation this summer and is expected to be offered during the regular fall and winter seasons in addition to our regular league play. Main features of this new concept, one which as been desired by some of our strong shooters for quite a long time, are:

- It is entirely a singles competition.
- Play consists of four 3 out of 5 matches in 501 SSDD, Cricket, Burma Road (Half-It) and 301 DIDD.
- Round robin play will be scheduled for the season.

- 4. There is a \$25 initiation fee plus \$5 weekly fees. This is in addition to the C.O.D. yearly dues.
- Monies will be totalled and paid back to the individual based on points earned.

Ben Roll began throwing darts in 1967 while in the Air Force in Biloxi, Mississippi. When he first came to Columbus in 1971, no one had started playing organized darts yet. (Or at least he didn't find out about it). It wasn't until 1978 that he started playing in the COD with some friends from AT&T -Mike Haines, Rod Foley and Harry Wasson. The name of this team was Bull-Throwers and they won a trophy the first season. Since then, Ben's dart game has come a long way. He has won over 50 trophies

and this past February won his first singles event at the Tommy Orr Memorial. Ben's wife, Debbie, recently won her first trophy playing with Ben at the Gavel Classic in May.

Another contribution Ben has made to darts is the development of the bracket system first used by the Bulls-Eye Marketing tournaments. Tournaments around the country are now using a modified version of this system. Ben spent 6 weeks constructing the first one.

When Ben is not throwing darts he enjoys long rides on his Harley-Davidson and can often be found at one of his favorite bars, Spankey's, on the west side. He also raises Kerry-Blue terriers and just had 3 new puppies a few weeks ago (that is, his dog did).

As Ben leaves Columbus and Central Ohio Darters, he is undefeated in his last 4 entries in Open Doubles and is this year's Open Doubles City Champion. Keep in touch, Ben.
