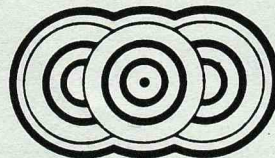

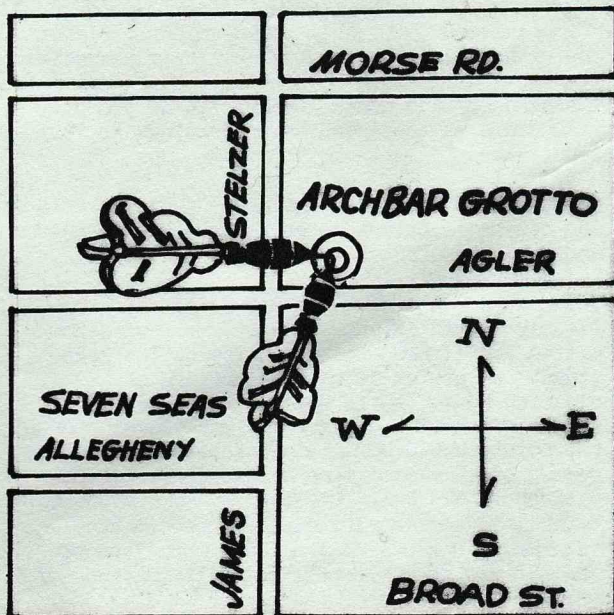

- 6:30 pm: Close registration for President's Tournament (Blind Draw Triples). Entry fee is \$1.00.
- 7:00 pm: Blind Draw Triples begin. All fees returned in prize money, plus trophies to top 4 teams. Format-801 Straight Start, Double Out. Best 2 out of 3 games.





PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



Have you ever considered running for the Board of Directors of the Central Ohio Darters? You have probably wondered how involved it could get. If so, consider the following.

First of all, where does your motivation come from? I hope you've eliminated "status". Being on the Board will not win more games for you or get a special parking space for you. Or conversly, just because you're a very good darter, don't expect you'll be a "natural" Board Member. I'm not trying to talk anyone out of being a Board Member. However, I feel you should consider whether you actually "need" to be a Board Member to accomplish your goal.

If you know of something about our club that bothers you, let us know. As a C.O.D. member you are more than welcome to attend the meetings. Just call the President at the time and ask him or her to put the topic you'd like to discuss on the agenda at the next board meeting. By doing this you'll get a much more receptive response than if you just mention your idea in passing at a blind draw somewhere.

Let's assume you've made up your mind to be a Board Member. Here are some of the things that will be expected of you...

You'll need to be able to volunteer at least one night per month for our regularly scheduled meetings. These are held usually the first Thursday of each month. Your regular prompt attendance at these and other meetings is very important.

"Special" Board Meetings are not predictable and can be inconvenient at times. However, you would be expected to attend if at all possible.

The subjects at Committee Meetings are obviously set in advance. As a member of a committee you'll need to attend few of its meetings. We prefer to use the meeting as a clearing house, so to speak. In other words, the majority of the unnecessary discussion of the point should be eliminated before the Chairperson of that committee brings their recommendations to the Board. For these committees to be most effective, I feel they need to have a minimum of 3 and a maximum of around 7 people. In this way we can expect more alternatives of

a point to be brought up and discussed. Some committees exist only to eliminate a problem. Others continue year after year. Our Bar Relations Committee is one of these on-going types.

There's one last method of using your free time...At our End of Season Parties, you'll usually see the Board Members scurrying around and just generally hob-nobbing. That's because they have to in most cases. It's not as bad as it was a few years back. Our list of reliable volunteers has grown. I would also like to say that they are very much appreciated. By the way "Volunteers", I'll be calling you soon if I haven't already!

Here's one other thing you might do if you're serious about being on the Board. Come to the last few meetings before elections. In that way, you already know what to expect if you make it.

Being on the Board isn't really as time consuming or bad as I may have made it sound. It's really not all too much like "work" as long as you remember a couple of things. Darts is a favorite game of yours. It is a growing sport here in Columbus, as well as across the nation. If you want to be a serious part of helping direct its growth locally, give it your best shot! Run for our Board!

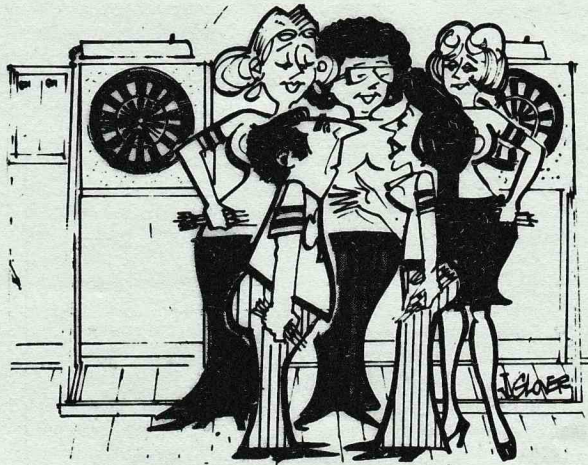

THE BOARD IN RESPONSE

In the last issue of the DART NEWS, two very emotional letters were printed. While there is some satisfaction received by those who express their gripes in emotional "slams", this kind of response usually does not help to solve any problems but rather serves to worsen any tensions and/or problems. This article addresses the issues expressed in the letter written to the Board of Directors and printed in the last DART NEWS.

The C.O.D. Board of Directors wishes to apologize to Verna Allen publicly for the cruel and hurtful question about "paying her with chicken" at the party. There were several dart players still involved in competition and several volunteers helping to make sure everyone else was satisfied, who had not eaten anything at all. Verna was asked to insure that there was sufficient chicken, rice, beans, etc. for these people to eat when they completed competition or finished their tasks.

At the end of the banquet, among the few who stayed to help take down equipment and clean tables was Verna Allen. At that time, all the food that remained was one tray of gravy for which there was no biscuits. No food remained for any of the volunteers to take home, including Verna.

Yes, several people did take home food late in the evening, long after everyone had eaten their fill of Sister's Chicken and Biscuits. And, yes, there might be a need to develop a policy for distributing extra food at future C.O.D. banquets. However, to accuse Verna of

hoarding food for herself instead of thanking her for volunteering and coordinating the activities of the day is a sad and shameful token of appreciation for her work. No apology can ever undo the hurt Verna has experienced, but it might help if those who wrote that letter would apologize to her personally.

The C.O.D. Board of Directors must also apologize to the employees of Sister's Chicken and Biscuits who were invited by the Board to join us in eating and drinking after they finished serving us. Their catering service has always been most helpful and courteous, and Mark Todd asked the manager of the Sister's employees to extend an invitation to them to have refreshments with us when they finished at 7:00 p.m. We can only hope the Sister's employees realize that the letter in question was written by a few who didn't bother to find out why they were eating and drinking after serving us, not that it should matter anyway.

The C.O.D. Board of Directors apologizes for any filthy language that came across the P.A. System. There is no excuse for this to happen, and those who use the P.A. System in the future at C.O.D. banquets, me included, must make sure that this does not happen again.

About the wine, there was wine present and it was at room temperature, which did get pretty warm. Wine is not a high priority item at our banquets, and it shows. This is not offered as an excuse, but rather as an encouragement for one of our wine drinkers to step forward and volunteer to control this function at future banquets. Then, maybe we would have sufficient wine at correct temperatures.

Concerning the truck driver watching the C.O.D. women, I feel that this is a credit to our women. However, if you were upset by his watching, why didn't you ask him to move or ask someone else to ask him to move instead of complaining about it after the fact when nothing can be done about it?

As Walt indicated in his response, we do need volunteers to help out and do welcome constructive criticism. However, this kind of unsigned letter will never in the future be printed in the DART NEWS or considered by the Board of Directors as a valid complaint.



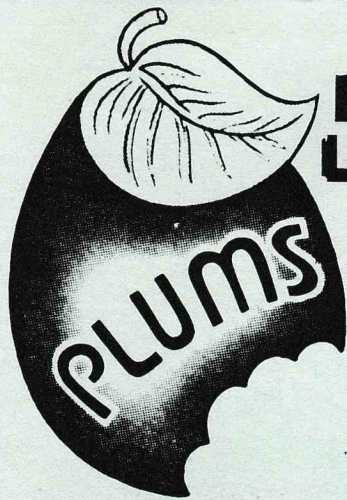

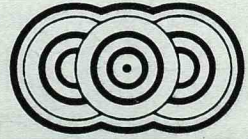
