2:00 Women's Singles


5:00 Dinner

President's message.

The Buckeye Open and Quad City Challenge were played on the weekend of November 22, 23 and 24, 1985. The Buckeye Open was an unqualified success as we had more participants in each event this year than previous years. In the Buckeye Open, Roger Roush was the only COD winner. He and Sterling Human (Cincinnati) teamed up to win the Friday night blind draw. In the Quad City Challenge, Cincinnati for the fourth year in a row captured top honors. Congratulations should go to the Columbus ladies team who finished second in the ladies event.

Darts in the Central Ohio area has seen a great upsurge in participants over the last several years. Currently, there are at least five active leagues in the Central Ohio area. Each of these leagues had at least

representative on the Central Ohio All Star Team. With this kind of cooperation between the leagues in Central Ohio, darting can only get better.

One of the requirements for playing in the COD is that all members be at least 21 years of age. This age limit requirement is caused by playing in bars. This age limit also restricts darters from getting experience and getting new darters to start. Sean McFall is one of these good, young darters. Sean is attempting to put together a youth league which will most likely play at Gahanna Lanes. The teams from Dayton and Columbus finished regulation play in a tie. In a playoff, the team from Dayton edged our home town darters for third place. All was not bleak for Columbus this day, however. Our women's team made their usual super showing finishing second in the women's point total. Let's all think about next year's Quad City Challenge and work for a return to glory for Team Columbus.

## BUCKEYE OPEN WRAP-UP


The third annual Buckeye Open was held November 22-24 at the Sinclair Plaza Motel. From the first dart fired in Friday's blind draw to the Winning dart in Sunday morning's four-person team event, the tournament was a success. We had a great turnout with people from cities all over the state, along with a few folks from Pennsylvania and Indiana. Work is already underway for next year's tourney. There are tentative plans to increase the prize money to make the Buckeye an even more attractive tournament. A special thanks to all the many volunteers who made the tournament possible.

I'd like to start off this new addition to the Newsletter with two bars that have made vast improvements to their dart areas. Each bar has been in the league for quite some time and with these improvements they have some of the finest throwing conditions in Columbus. The two bars featured are Kelley's Tavern, 1325 S. Ohio Avenue, and Ledo's Lounge, 2608 N. High Street.

Kelley's, which changed hands on August 1, 1985, has made significant improvements since Frank Merz took over. The biggest change has been the installation of central heating and cooling. This means that the big, green heater, which made darting in the winter more of a challenge than it already is, has been removed. Darters will no longer have to choose between heat and uncontrollable darts or cold and controllable darts. With the removal of the blower, all six boards are now along the same wall, providing plenty of space behind each toe line. The next noticeable changes are the lowered ceiling and new lighting over each board. This has taken care of the mystery light at the far end of the bar. Another improvement for those who like music when throwing, a speaker, has been placed in the darting room. Kelley's opens at 10 am Monday through Saturday and closes at midnight, although he does have a one o'clock license, and on Sunday noon to 6 pm. The kitchen is open all the time and has a new upgraded menu. Frank has also applied for a liquor license. Boards are always open for play. So, if you haven't been to Kelley's lately, you're in for a good surprise.

Ledo's Lounge also has improved its darting area. No longer are the darters and pool players sharing the same room. Since October, Steve Niswonger has redone the room to the left of the bar. In this room hang 6 boards with plenty of space to throw. Ledo's is open from noon to 2:30 am Monday through Saturday and is closed on Sunday. On Friday night there is a modest \$1 cover charge and on Saturday night there is a \$2 cover charge for Oldies Night. which draws quite a crowd. The boards are always open for play, and Ledo's does serve food every day but Saturday night.

This issue's feature darter is one of the many "dart couples" we have in the COD. Chances are you have met both of them, and chances are even better that once you hear their name, you'll start to abbreviate it as we all do -Ralph R. and Shirley R. (also known as Ralph and Shirley Riemenschneider).

Shirley and Ralph have been playing darts for 7 and 8 years respectively. Ken Pfeifer got Ralph interested in the game when they worked together, and Shirley followed along a year later, playing on a team called "Ralph's Farm Team." Ralph and Shirley have both played on a variety of teams since. Ralph is currently making his second appearance in the "A" division with Long's Commercial Art Supply, while Shirley is playing with the B-Wears.

While Ralph and Shirley have won many events throwing separately, they also have several trophies that they won together. The Riemenschneiders threw together three summer seasons in a row, walking off with trophies in mixed doubles in 1979 and 1980 and a 2nd in the open doubles in 1981. They are also past champions of the Crest Guys and Dolls Tournament.


Shirley has quite a few accomplishments to her credit. She has been on the COD All-Star team 5 of its 6 years, was the second woman to hit a T80 in the COD, and was one of the first women to play in "A" division. In addition, she has twice represented the COD in the ADO All-Star Regional Qualifiers, and one year placed 3rd in our region. Shirley has also given a lot back to our sport, serving on the COD Board of Directors for 3 years and as Editor of the Newsletter for 2 years. She has

participated in the Masters League and is currently playing in the Columbus Pro League, in which she won a trip first time out. Shirley used her winning trip to travel to Boston for the Witch City Open, which she combined with a vacation traveling through New England with Ralph.

In addition to his T80 mug, Ralph, too, has many trophies from various local tournaments, parties and leagues. However, you may be more likely to find Ralph enjoying an informal game at the Short North, Crest or Bier Stube. Ralph is also well-known for his hand-etched, personalized chalkboards, each one individualized for the particular owner.

When not throwing darts, the Riemenschneiders enjoy a variety of interests including music and traveling. They were two of the lucky few from the COD who went to the 1983 Hawaiian Open, and got to combine darts with another of their favorite pasttimes. So, whether you see Shirley lining up at the toe line at the Pro League, or Ralph practicing at one of his favorite watering holes, say, "Hi!" to two of the nicest people in the COD. Did you ever consider the fact that when you first started throwing darts, you missed more than you hit? I've stood at a board for hours, missing more than I was hitting. Did you ever wonder why, if you were missing more than you were hitting, you didn't get better at missing? The fact is the quicker you forget your misses, the quicker you will start hitting.

Psychologists have proven, to an extent, that everything you experience from birth is permanently captured in your memory banks. Recalling experiences can be difficult since you don't really forget anything you learn. Psychologists have proven that the next best way to eliminate negative thoughts is to displace them with positive thoughts.

Have you ever tried to learn a TV commercial jingle? Hearing or seeing something through spaced repetition causes it to be remembered whether you are trying to remember or not. When you hit exactly what you are shooting for, you are feeding your brain positive thoughts. It feels good. You remember. Eventually the memory of hits will displace the memory of misses, provided the hits do come. If all you could do was to remember perfect darts, your game would surely reflect this. Unfortunately, the memory of misses will reflect in your game also.

Let me tell you about the ten-foot 2x4 lying on the ground. Could you walk the 2x4 from end to end without falling off to pick up a ten-dollar bill? Now, let's put the plank ten stories high between two buildings. Would you walk the plank for a \$10 bill? Would you crawl across it for \$100? What controls your answer? The fact is negative thoughts will produce negative results. The clearer you can picture perfect results, the better your results will be.

Here is the short cut to produce perfect results without hours and hours of far less than perfect physical practice. Stick your 3 darts perfectly in the triple 20 and look at and study them for 5 minutes a day for a week. Visualizing perfect darts will mentally displace memories of misses.

Your darts aren't magic. They don't know how to go where they are supposed to go. Your hand holds and releases the dart, but your hand doesn't know how to put them where they are supposed to be. Your arm moves your hand, but your arm and muscles don't know how to make your dart hit the target. The one place all of your results come from is your brain. Mentally - practice perfect, and physically - the results will be achieved.




