BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Your Board of Directors has been active over the summer. Besides getting things in order for the new year that started Sept 1, they have been spending a lot of time planning for the future as well.

A significant change was made to the By-Laws in August. The number of Board Members was reduced from 13 to 11. This was done primarily to make the Board a more efficient working body.




